**J.T. BROWN SCULPTURES SELECTED FOR “BEST AND BRIGHTEST” SHOW,
“CELEBRATION OF FINE ART”**

INCLINE VILLAGE, Nv., January 16, 2009 --- June Towill Brown of J.T. Brown Sculptures has been accepted to submit her most recent bronze, *Gypsy Fire*, for the Scottsdale “Best and Brightest Juried Art Show and Sale”, February 18 – March 18, 2010. Now in its 25th year, the show will offer more than 100 works of art for sale selected from over 300 entries. Juried categories include oil painting, watercolor, pastel/drawing, and sculpture. Prices range from \$200 to \$6,000.

In collaboration with this prestigious show, Brown’s artistry will also be displayed at the “Celebration of Fine Art” ten week festival in Scottsdale, Az., through March 18, 2010. Art & Antiques Magazine noted this show as “...one of the premiere art events in the West.” With more than 40,000 square feet filled with works by known and emerging artists, first time buyers to serious collectors agree this juried, invitational show and sale is a “must see”. This 20th annual event is sponsored by the City of Scottsdale.

The selected sculpture is the first bronze in the collection of Brown’s latest “Series of Three” entitled *Gentle Giants*. *Gypsy Fire* will be coupled in 2010 with two additional elaborate sculptures of the extraordinary equine Gypsy Vanner breed. Brown created the new theme to “showcase this powerful yet gentle breed that has a mystical history of time gone by,” according to artist June Towill Brown.
