ARTWORK PROVIDES LASTING MEMORIES, FAMILY HEIRLOOMS, FOR EXTRA SPECIAL GIFTS *~ JT Brown Sculptures Unveils Latest "Series of Three" Just in Time for the Holidays ~*

(INCLINE VILLAGE, Nevada) October 19, 2009 --- With one of the busiest seasons of celebration just around the corner, it's time to think about unique and appropriate gifts for the holidays. When everyone is looking harder and smarter for "just the right gift," artist June Towill Brown of J.T. Brown Sculptures suggests consumers take a look at artwork - bronze or lucite sculptures in particular - as a smart option for the serious shopper. "Gift giving can be one of the most enjoyable ways to spend, and invest, your money," she noted. "And when the gift provides a direct emotional connection from the giver to the recipient, the value of the gift can truly be priceless."

Why would one purchase a bronze sculpture? While toys and technology come and go, Brown believes an investment in art - as an heirloom - is much more personal, and emotional. "An engaging work can provide its owner with a lifetime of visual pleasure and lifelong memories." Referring to her award-winning Arabian horse series, Brown provided further insight. "My *Bloodline* sculpture is a bust of a stallion, a mare and their foal. *Bloodline* depicts the 'circle of life'... just like a father's love, sculptured artwork has proven itself through time." Everything that Brown creates tells a story in a "Series of Three" that often depict this 'circle of life' approach.

New Gentle Giants *Series of Three* Unveiled October 10

Well known for her "*Series of Three*", Brown unveiled the first bronze of her newest "Gentle Giants" *series* on October 10th - just in time for the holiday shopping season. The sculpture, entitled "Gypsy Fire", is the initial bronze which will be joined later this fall by two additional elaborate sculptures of the extraordinary equine Gypsy Vanner breed. Brown created the new theme to "showcase this powerful yet gentle breed that has a mystical history of time gone by," according to artist June Towill Brown.

While the breeding of these "magical" horses has been noted as "careful and deliberate", the detailed history of their blood line rests in the memory of the gypsy families who bred them centuries ago. With a long flowing mane, tail and feathered hooves, the Gypsy Vanner drafts are descended from a combination of Shires, Friesian, Clydesdale and Dale Ponies, with their origins in the United Kingdom and Ireland. "They are as powerful in build ... as they are gentle in nature," Brown noted.

Much like Brown’s Friesian sculptures in her “Horse Power” *Series of Three*, the Gypsy Vanner has a long mane, long tail and is also very muscular. However, its most unique feature is its tobiano coloring with a distinctive white and black coat. “The alternating color pattern is irregular and asymmetrical – which was a real challenge to depict in a bronze.” According to Brown, the sculpture has a custom colored patina in black and white to show the dramatic coloration of this breed. The Gypsy Vanner is available in a limited edit of 35 in bronze.

New Lucite “Gypsy Fire” Sculpture Set for Fall Unveiling

As an artist for over 30 years, Brown knows that bronze sculptures are timeless and show well in both traditional and contemporary collections. Taking this one step further, she will unveil a new Lucite design for those seeking a more modern investment while still appreciating its original clay art form. “We are using frosted Lucite for the body of the horse and clear Lucite for the flowing mane, tail and feathered hooves,” Brown explained. “Lucite is a stunning material for the more contemporary collection, especially when it is lit from above or below sculpture. We are all very excited to unveil this new medium with Gypsy Fire as our showcase this fall.”

Brown noted that the Lucite sculpture will be offered in a limited edition of 250; both the Lucite and bronze sculptures come with a swivel base and measure 22” in length, 10” in diameter and 21” high.

Gypsy Spirit and Gypsy Dancer Set for Future Unveilings

June Towill Brown will continue her presentation style in true form with the unveiling of two additional Gypsy Vanner sculptures later this year; entitled “Gypsy Spirit” and “Gypsy Dancer”, each will be offered in limited editions as well.
